Preparation by Administrations

- ratification of MARPOL Annex VI, the official acceptance by a country to become a Party thereto;
- 2 incorporating the provisions of MARPOL Annex VI into national legislation;
- 3 designation of enforcement authorities;
- 4 issuance of certificates of compliance;
- 5 penalties for non-compliance;
- 6 implementation of regulations for monitoring and reporting;
- 7 capacity building, training and technical assistance;
- 8 raising stakeholder and public awareness; and
- 9 participation in international cooperation and coordination among Mediterranean coastal States and stakeholders.

Preparation by Other Designated Authorities Explanation of involvement of other inspectors and specialized laboratories

Importance of regulations regarding fuel oil availability and quality

Preparation by Shipowners

- Familiarizing with regulations
- Evaluating fleet compliance status
- Fuel management strategies, low sulphur fuels, investment other technologies as scrubbers
- Training of seafarers
- Fuel oil changeover procedures
- Reporting procedures, accurate records of fuel purchases, emission data and compliance related activities to demonstrate adherence
- Communication channels with authorities, industry forums etc
- Contingency plans

Preparation by Ports

- Port-related preparations including facility upgrades, waste reception, and fuel availability
- Familiarization with regulations and coordination with stakeholders

Preparation by Fuel Oil Suppliers

- Investing in new production facilities and implementing testing methods
- Obligations regarding registration and compliance with specifications
- Register with relevant government authority to be included in the list of fuel suppliers

Preparation by other stakeholders

- Environmental organizations advocate for reducing air pollution and protecting marine ecosystems in the Mediterranean.
- Industry associations and trade groups represent maritime interests and promote collaboration.
- Research institutions provide expertise and support for implementing MARPOL Annex VI.
- Local communities and civil society groups call for cleaner air and are key stakeholders.

Mechanisms for consultation

- Consultation, feedback, and collaboration are essential for enforcing the 0.10% m/m sulphur limit under MARPOL Annex VI in the Med SOx ECA.
- Stakeholder engagement with shipping companies, port authorities, fuel suppliers, and local communities ensures a comprehensive understanding of compliance challenges.
- Stakeholder feedback identifies barriers like fuel availability and infrastructure limitations.
