PROPOSED MEDIUM TERM PROGRAMME OF PRIORITY ACTIVITIES, 2000 - 2003, AND DECISIONS AND GUIDANCE FOR THE 2000 - 2001 BIENNIUM PROGRAMME

Note by REMPEC

1. The Meeting of REMPEC Focal Points needs to conclude on the activities regarding a regional strategy for prevention, preparedness and response to pollution in the marine environment from seabased activities, which will be implemented within the framework of MAP Phase II, the revision of the Protocol and the redefinition of the objectives and functions of REMPEC.

2. A preliminary draft of the four-year medium term programme for 2000 - 2003 for REMPEC's activities in the field of prevention, preparedness and response to pollution of the marine environment from sea-based activities is presented in Annex I of this document. The preliminary draft of the medium term programme is presented in such a way as to identify as much as possible all the components of the programme (see paragraph 4). This will facilitate adjustments, changes and modifications depending on the conclusions of the Meeting of National Legal and Technical Experts and the Meeting of Focal Points.

3. For the 2000 - 2001 biennium, a preliminary draft programme can be found in Annex II. The programme has been prepared on the basis of the Centre's current budget and therefore only covers the part regarding preparedness and co-operation in the event of a marine pollution emergency which is a continuation of previous medium term programmes approved by the Contracting Parties.

4. The following are the general orientation of proposed future activities and actions for a regional strategy for prevention, preparedness, response and mutual assistance:

I. <u>Prevention of pollution by ships</u>

- A. Building national capacities
 - i) improving the capacities of administrations (in charge of maritime transport and environment) to develop and implement prevention policies through:

- training courses;
- delivery of information and expert assistance including access to technology, technology transfer and methods thereof;
- pilot programmes;
- ii) developing hardware infrastructural resources through:
 - technical and pre-investment studies;
 - pilot projects.

B. Develop regional co-operation

- i) conducting co-ordinated actions through organized consultation at all levels: national, regional and global (in IMO) in specific fields such as: anti-fouling paints, navigation in sensitive areas, ballast water, traffic separation schemes, etc.;
- ii) implementing programmes that require concerted action and measures at the regional level in fields such as: reception facilities, port state control, aerial surveillance;
- iii) carrying out studies on matters of regional interest, such as salvage and emergency towing capacities in the Mediterranean.

II. Preparedness, response and co-operation in the event of accidental marine pollution (continuation of the already established strategy)

- A. Concerning preparedness and response, the Centre should:
 - i) continue to develop and maintain the Regional Information System and develop tools as an aid to decision taking;
 - ii) focus its intent and action mainly on developing national systems for preparedness and response as well as facilitating the adoption of sub-regional contingency systems;
 - iii) organize a training programme geared to the requirements of the region with special attention paid to providing assistance to States so they can deliver their own national training courses and by giving the priority to countries that need them most. This will have to fall within the budget window allocated to the Centre for this activity;
 - iv) undertake and co-operate in activities with the appropriate organizations regarding preparedness and response to maritime related accidents involving hazardous substances that occur in port areas or their approaches;
 - v) organize exercises so as to test the regional co-operation scheme;
 - vi) prepare new provisions and procedures that will apply in the event of international cooperation and assistance;
 - vii) continue and intensify the contacts and relations with organizations that represent the shipping, oil and chemical industries with a view to facilitate the development of cooperation between government and industry;
 - viii) organize and maintain the Mediterranean Assistance Unit, MAU, in a state of readiness.

- B. In the event of accidental marine pollution, at the request of States, in compliance with its objectives and functions and due account being given to the resources available, REMPEC should:
 - highlight and provide technical advice and information that States my require and use accordingly the Regional Information System that was developed and that is kept up to date by the Centre;
 - ii) activate the MAU to assist in response;
 - iii) assist in securing and co-ordinating international assistance irrespective of whether the equipment, products or strike teams are provided by government or industry;
 - iv) strive to assist the affected States to disseminate information;
 - v) disseminate information on "lesson learnt".
- C. <u>Prevention of pollution of the marine environment as a result of offshore production and exploration activities</u>
 - i) fulfil the function of Secretariat as stated in the Protocol (function assigned to the "Organization").

<u>Resources required to implement the activities for a regional strategy for prevention,</u> <u>preparedness and response</u>

5. For the implementation of such a programme, certain conditions, administrative and/or financial, would need to be met which would be the following:

- a) REMPEC will need more staff to run the complete programme successfully. In this regard, the Centre envisages that it will need the following additional staff component:
 - i) a programme officer to deal with the new field of prevention;
 - ii) a programme officer to deal with administrative and financial matters (see agenda item 10);
 - iii) a computer expert.
- b) Regarding preparedness, response and co-operation in the event of accidental marine pollution, the financial implications would be much the same as in the past although the workload will increase slightly. However, implementing this part of the programme will only be possible if the condition mentioned in paragraph (a ii) above is met since the majority of the work is done by the present staff at the Centre. If the condition is not met, the Centre will probably have to down-scale certain activities.
- c) Regarding the prevention of pollution by ships, the conditions laid down in (a) need to be wholly met. The action and activities planned will be conducted within the framework of clearly defined programmes and projects.
- d) Regarding the implementation of the Offshore Protocol, this will require additional finances to be made available through the MAP budget.

Action requested of the Meeting of Focal Points

- 6, The Meeting is invited to:
 - a) examine and approve the draft medium term programme for 2000 2003 that will be presented to the next Meeting of Contracting Parties;
 - b) discuss and approve the draft programme for the 2000 2001 biennium and give REMPEC guidance on this matter;
 - c) give guidance to the Director for the preparation of a needs analysis and budgetary requirements for the new activities to be presented to the next Meeting of Contracting Parties with prior circulation to the Governmental Focal Points for input.
