#### PROPOSED PROGRAMME OF REMPEC ACTIVITIES AND BUDGET ESTIMATES FOR BIENNIUM 2006/2007

### Note by REMPEC

# I INTRODUCTION

1. The 2002 Protocol concerning Cooperation in Preventing Pollution from Ships and, in Cases of Emergency, Combating Pollution of the Mediterranean Sea (hereinafter referred to as "2002 Prevention and Emergency Protocol") that was adopted on the 25 January 2002 by the Conference of Plenipotentiaries (Malta, 24-25 January 2002), entered into force on 17 March 2004, after being ratified by six contracting Parties. At present, seven Contracting Parties have ratified the Protocol.

2. Besides activities related to preparedness for and response to marine pollution incidents, since the 6<sup>th</sup> Meeting of its Focal Points REMPEC carried out, initiated or prepared a number of activities or projects, related to the implementation of the provisions of the 2002 Prevention and Emergency Protocol in the domain of prevention of pollution from ships (c.f. REMPEC/WG.26/4). These actions were taken In conformity with the Resolution of the Conference of the Plenipotentiaries convened in Malta in January 2002, which calls for commencement of the implementation at both the national and regional levels of the Prevention and Emergency Protocol, pending its entry into force.

3. With a view to implementing the Prevention and Emergency Protocol, the Thirteenth Ordinary Meeting of the Contracting Parties, held in Catania, Italy, 11-14 November 2003 decided to adopt, at its Fourteenth Meeting scheduled to be held in November 2005 in Slovenia, a Regional Strategy for prevention of and response to marine pollution from ships. The same Meeting also adopted the "Catania Declaration" thus clearly expressing the political will of the Contracting Parties to take concerted action to reduce and, as much as possible, eliminate the pollution of the Mediterranean Sea from ships and sea based activities in general. The "Catania Declaration" *inter alia* identified specific issues that the future Regional Strategy should address as priority.

4. In order to prepare the draft Regional Strategy for submission to the Fourteenth Meeting of the Contracting Parties, REMPEC convened two Meetings of National Experts, the first of which was held in Castelgandolfo (Rome), Italy, between 8 and 10 July 2004, and the second one was convened, immediately prior to the present Meeting, in Malta between 21 and 23 April 2005. These Meetings, as well as comments on the three draft versions of the Regional Strategy received from the Contracting Parties since the 6<sup>th</sup> Meeting of REMPEC Focal Points, identified the needs of the Contracting Parties in the fields of prevention of, preparedness for and response to marine pollution from ships, as well as the appropriate actions to be taken with a view to meeting these needs.

5. In 2004 the EC approached REMPEC with a view to developing a project on Euro-Mediterranean (Euromed) cooperation on maritime safety and prevention of pollution from ships (SAFEMED) within the framework of the Euromed Transport Forum (c.f. REMPEC/WG.26/7). The objective of the project was to enhance maritime safety and the protection of marine environment in the Mediterranean region through promoting a coherent, effective and uniform implementation of the relevant international conventions and related EU legislation, and was therefore fully compatible with the priority goals of the Regional Strategy. The EC identified REMPEC as the most appropriate regional institution for the implementation of the SAFEMED project considering the important role the Centre plays in this field within the framework of the Mediterranean Action Plan (MAP) and in close collaboration with the International Maritime Organization (IMO).

6. With the assistance of a consultant and in close co-operation with the relevant services of the EC and IMO, REMPEC prepared and submitted to the EC the draft project document, which is at present awaiting the final approval and the signing of the contract for its implementation by the EC and IMO on behalf of REMPEC.

# II PRELIMINARY DRAFT PROGRAMME OF ACTIVITIES FOR THE BIENNIUM 2006/2007

7. REMPEC prepared the proposed preliminary draft programme of activities, which is attached in **Annex I** to the present document, taking into consideration the following elements:

- a) Continuation of and upgrading the core activities of the Centre originating from the 2002 Prevention and Emergency Protocol and from the present Objectives and Functions assigned to the Centre by the Contracting Parties at their Twelfth Ordinary Meeting, held in Monaco in November 2001;
- b) Activities and projects carried out, initiated, prepared or being implemented during the biennium 2004/2005, in the fields of prevention of, preparedness for and response to pollution of the Mediterranean Sea from sea based activities;
- c) The priority issues to be addressed at the national, sub-regional and regional levels, as identified by the Contracting Parties in the "Catania Declaration";
- d) The work carried out so far on the development of the Regional Strategy for prevention of and response to marine pollution from ships, and its already agreed general and specific objectives; and
- e) The proposed SAFEMED project, with the assumption that it would be approved for implementation by the Centre during the period September 2005 2008.

8. It is emphasized that the proposed preliminary draft programme of activities of the Centre for the biennium 2006/2007 includes a number of activities complementing certain tasks of the SAFEMED project. These are meant to be carried out in the thirteen Mediterranean coastal States which are Contracting Parties to the Barcelona Convention but which are not eligible for funding under the SAFEMED project.

9. On the basis of the above listed elements, the following general needs among the Contracting Parties could be identified in each of the three main areas of REMPEC's mandate, namely the cooperation in prevention of pollution from ships, preparedness for and response to accidental marine pollution:

#### Prevention of the pollution of the marine environment from ships

• The need to promote through regional co-operation the implementation and the enforcement of the IMO Conventions for prevention of pollution of the marine environment by ships.

# Preparedness for and response to accidental marine pollution, and related co-operation

 The need to assist those Mediterranean coastal States which still do not have national capabilities for response to accidents causing or likely to cause pollution of the sea by oil and other harmful substances, to develop such capabilities;

- The need to strengthen the capacities of the Mediterranean coastal States for responding to accidents causing or likely to cause pollution of the sea by oil and other harmful substances, particularly in cases of emergency, in which there is grave and imminent danger to the marine environment, or when these can affect human lives;
- The need to facilitate co-operation among the Contracting Parties in order to respond to such events;

### Capacity building and co-operation

- The need to facilitate information exchange, technological co-operation and training;
- The need to provide a framework for exchange of information on operational, technical, scientific, legal and financial matters.

10. Bearing in mind the importance which the 2002 Prevention and Emergency Protocol gives to prevention of pollution from ships, as well as the significant results already achieved in the field of preparedness for and response to marine pollution accidents, the proposed preliminary draft programme of activities for the biennium 2006/2007 puts emphasis on prevention related activities.

### III PREVENTION OF POLLUTIONS FROM SHIPS

11. The general orientations of the proposed future activities and actions of the Centre, as regards prevention of ship generated pollution of the marine environment in the Mediterranean, that were presented to the 6<sup>th</sup> Meeting of REMPEC Focal Points in document REMPEC/WG.21/10 and subsequently endorsed by the Meeting, were also taken into consideration when preparing the proposed programme for the next biennium. The same applies to the activities planned in the preparedness and response field. This approach ensured the necessary continuity between the activities completed, initiated and prepared during the biennium 2004/2005 and those planned for the biennium 2006/2007.

12. It is recalled that the general orientations of REMPEC activities and actions for the prevention of ship generated pollution outlined in 2003 (REMPEC/WG.21/10) included in particular:

- Actions related to the analysis of the current situation in the region (marine pollution prevention policies and actions, assessment of the situation regarding ship generated pollution, assessment of risks in relation to maritime traffic)
- Capacity building at national, sub-regional and regional levels (assistance in development of national administrative systems and legislation for effective implementation and enforcement of international conventions through training, dissemination of information, expert advisory services and pilot programmes; support the development of required infrastructural resources through studies and pilot projects)
- Development of regional co-operation (providing a framework for organizing consultations and co-ordinating actions on specific issues at sub-regional, regional and global levels, development and facilitation of specific programmes, studying and co-ordinating actions on matters of regional interest, studying the feasibility of harmonizing national policies for sanctioning offences of Annex I of MARPOL)

13. A number of specific activities in the field of prevention of pollution from ships, included in the programme of activities for the current biennium, were either carried out and implemented or are still being carried out (c.f. REMPEC/WG. 26/4), while others were either prepared or incorporated into the SAFEMED project for the implementation in the forthcoming biennium. These include in particular:

 CLEANMED project on prevention of operational marine pollution in the Mediterranean, whose first component (improvement of the legislative framework) will be financed under SAFEMED project, while the second one (reinforcement of human resources) under GEF-Mediterranean partnership

- a geographically limited pilot project on surveillance and detection of illicit pollution (AESOP), which will be implemented in co-operation with the EC/JRC, ERS/RAC and several Italian governmental bodies and public institutions
- a study on maritime transport in the Mediterranean with a specific reference to oil and chemical transport (included in SAFEMED), and
- activities related to prevention of pollution from pleasure craft (c.f. REMPEC/WG.26/8)

# IV PREPAREDNESS AND RESPONSE TO ACCIDENTAL MARINE POLLUTION

14. In 2003 the general orientations of REMPEC proposed activities and actions related to accidental marine pollution preparedness, response and co-operation addressed the following main groups of issues, which still remain valid:

- further strengthening of the regional mechanisms for co-operation and assistance, in particular in case of emergency
- development of sub-regional systems for preparedness and response, including in particular bilateral or multilateral operational agreements among the neighbouring countries, and
- maintaining and/or developing, as appropriate, national capacities for dealing with marine pollution incidents.

# V OTHER ACTIVITIES

15. Eventually, as regards the actions planned in order to meet the needs of the Contracting Parties regarding information exchange and dissemination, training and technological co-operation, the activities proposed to be carried out in 2006/2007 biennium focus on actions that complement general orientations in the three major areas within the mandate of REMPEC.

### VI FINANCING

16. In addition to the activities meant to be financed by the Mediterranean Trust Fund (MTF), the proposed preliminary draft programme also lists the activities that are expected to be financed, completely or partly, by various external sources of financing. These include in particular the MEDA mechanism of the EC, Integrated Technical Cooperation Programme (ITCP) of the Technical Cooperation Division of IMO, Global Environment Facility (GEF), as well as possible voluntary contributions of individual Contracting Parties such as the EC, Italy and Monaco which had voluntarily contributed to the REMPEC's budget during the current biennium. It is expected that the external sources of financing will largely contribute to satisfying identified needs of the Contracting Parties, which could not be covered under the expected MTF budget alone, in view of its limitations.

17. The envisaged sources of financing of activities proposed in the preliminary draft programme of activities for the biennium 2006/2007 are also indicated in **Annex I** to the present document.

18. The budgetary allocations shown in the proposed programme of activities in **Annex I** are only tentative. It is assumed that total amount of REMPEC budget, as approved by the Contracting Parties for the biennium 2004/2005 at the Thirteen Ordinary Meeting held in Catania, Italy, 11-14 November 2003 (UNEP(DEC)/MED IG.13/8, Annex V, page 3) will not change. However, it is emphasized that the MAP Coordinating Unit informed the Centre that any increases and/or changes in salaries for the biennium would have to be compensated by a decrease in allocations for the activities. On the basis of the views expressed by the present Meeting, REMPEC will present the estimated budget allocations for each proposed activity to the next Meeting of MAP Focal Points, scheduled for September 2005, prior to their submission for approval to the Fourteenth Ordinary Meeting of the Contracting Parties to the Barcelona Convention, scheduled for November 2005.

# VII PERSONNEL

19. The effective implementation of the proposed programme of activities for the biennium 2006/7 requires complementing the present staff of REMPEC as outlined in **Annex II**. The SAFEMED project proposal envisages the employment of three additional professional staff members (Programme Officer L4, Programme Officer L3 and an Administrator L3) as well as an additional general service

staff member (Administrative Assistant G6). It is emphasized that the implementation of the proposed preliminary draft programme of activities strictly depends on the strengthening of the present complement of REMPEC's staff, paid by the MTF, with the additional personnel paid through the voluntary contributions of the Italian Government and the French oil industry, and with the personnel envisaged to be recruited under the SAFEMED project.

**The Meeting of Focal Points is invited to** examine and endorse the preliminary draft programme of activities for 2006/2007 biennium, which will be presented to the forthcoming Meeting of MAP Focal Points and subsequently submitted for approval to the Contracting Parties at their Fourteenth Ordinary Meeting.
