	SUMMARY
Executive Summary:	This document contains in its Annex the proposed programme of work for REMPEC for the biennium 2012-2013 and explains the rationale used to prepare the proposed programme of work.

1. The proposed programme of work for the Centre for the biennium 2012-2013 is attached to this document as an **Annex**.

2. As explained in REMPEC's Circular Letter 07/2011 this draft work programme was prepared within the framework of the five year Programme of Work for the Mediterranean Action Plan (UNEP/MAP) as adopted by the Contracting Parties to the Barcelona Convention at their 16th Ordinary Meeting (Decision IG.9/8).

3. This draft programme of work was circulated to REMPEC's national Focal Points with a view to obtaining their input prior to the Meeting.

4. Moreover, it should be noted that the MAP proposed programme of work for the biennium 2012-2013, incorporating all proposals from the MAP Components, has been circulated by the MAP Co-ordinating Unit on 4 April 2011 to the MAP Focal Points, as requested by the Contracting Parties in the Governance paper (Decision IG.17/5). The numbering of the activities in the attached work programme of the Centre reflects the numbering in the proposed programme of work for MAP in order to facilitate cross references. Once the present Meeting of REMPEC Focal Points will have discussed, amended and endorsed the draft, the final version will be transmitted to the Co-ordinating Unit for its inclusion in the programme of work for MAP which will be submitted to the consideration of MAP Focal Points during their forthcoming Meeting scheduled for the 6-9 September 2011.

5. This new format of the programme of work of MAP, designed to give a clearer picture of the main goals and strategies followed by MAP as a whole, does not hinder the relevance of the specific objectives identified in the Regional Strategy for Prevention of and Response to Marine Pollution from Ships, adopted by the Contracting Parties in 2005 (Decision IG. 16/13) and the proposed programme of work of the Centre builds upon the results of the activities which have been implemented during the biennium 2010-2011.

6. On the financial side, the initial draft programme of work has been prepared taking into account the expected funds to be made available through the Mediterranean Trust Fund (MTF), the activities expected to be financed through the IMO Integrated Technical Cooperation Programme (IMO/ITCP) and the European Commission (EC) financed project "SAFEMED II". Other co-operation projects under development are indicated, as appropriate.

7. With regard to the abovementioned sources of financing, the following remarks have to be noted:

- MTF: pending the outcome of an ongoing financial audit and the decision to be taken by the Contracting Parties regarding the financing of a shortfall recently assessed by UNEP, the level of activities has been established based on precautionary recommendations from UNEP Headquarters translating in a reduction of 20% of funds available for commitment.
- IMO/ITCP: This programme regularly finances activities implemented by the Centre in the Mediterranean region. However, the decision regarding the allocation of funds for activities to be implemented by REMPEC for the biennium 2012-2013 will only be known in the second part of 2011 according to the IMO customary decision making process.
- SAFEMED II Project: the SAFEMED II Project is due to terminate at the end of 2011. However, in view of the expected remaining balance of the Project's Funds, the Centre has proposed a one-year extension (2012) to the EC, which is currently under consideration.

8. As a consequence of the above remarks, many activities are earmarked in the column: EXT 2 which means that the specific activity is funded by external funds still not secured.

9. The Meeting of Focal Points is invited to comment, amend as appropriate, and endorse the proposed programme of work for the Centre for the biennium 2012-2013 with a view to its submission to the MAP Focal Points Meeting to be held in Athens on 6-9 September 2011.
