Background

- The proposed programme of work of the Centre for the biennium 2016/2017, which is presented in the **Annex** to the present document, was prepared within the context of the Draft Strategic Framework of the United Nations Environment Programme/Mediterranean Action Plan (UNEP/MAP)'s Integrated Six-Year Programme of Work for the period 2016 to 2021 ("the draft Strategic Framework") (REMPEC/WG.37/INF.3).
- It should be noted that the draft Strategic Framework was discussed by the Meeting of the MAP Focal Points, which was convened in Athens, Greece from 19 to 21 May 2015. So far, the numbering of the activities in the draft programme of work of the Centre reflects the numbering in the draft Strategic Framework in order to facilitate cross-references. However, since the structure and numbering of the draft Strategic Framework will be modified with a view to reflecting the outcome of the discussions held at the Meeting of the MAP Focal Points, the present Meeting is requested to only focus on the technical aspects related to the activities listed in the draft programme of work of the Centre. Once the draft is considered, discussed and agreed upon by the present Meeting, the final version will be adapted to the new structure and numbering of the revised draft Strategic Framework and transmitted to the MAP Secretariat for its inclusion in the MAP Programme of Work, which will be submitted for approval by the next Meeting of the MAP Focal Points scheduled for October 2015 prior to its submission for adoption by the Nineteenth Ordinary Meeting of the Contracting Parties to the Barcelona Convention and its Protocols, to be tentatively held in February 2016 in Greece.
- 3 The draft Strategic Framework, designed to give a clearer picture of the main goals and strategies followed by MAP as a whole, does not hinder the relevance of the priorities and Specific Objectives identified in the Revised Draft Regional Strategy for Prevention of and Response to Marine Pollution from Ships (2016-2021), reproduced in Appendix 1 of document REMPEC/WG.37/11/1, and

the proposed programme of work of the Centre was prepared on the basis of such priorities and Specific Objectives.

On the financial side, further to the instruction of the MAP Secretariat and, taking into account that the MAP budget for the biennium 2016/2017 will be discussed at the next Meeting of the MAP Focal Points scheduled for October 2015, the draft programme of work of the Centre does not provide any specific figure although budgetary considerations were duly made when preparing it.
