DISPOSAL AND DISCHARGES

- Waste and Hazardous and Noxious Substances & Material (HNS&M)
- Oil and Oily Mixtures and Drilling Fluid and Cuttings
- Sewage
- Garbage
- Reception Facilities, Instructions And Sanctions
- Exceptions

MONITORING OF ENVIRONMENT RELATED ISSUES

- Report periodically to the competent authorities monitoring data
- Established a national monitoring system
- Competent authority in charge of establishing monitoring procedures

SAFETY MEASURES

- Design, construction, placement, equipment, marking, operation and maintenance
- Certificate of safety and fitness
- Monitoring system
- Periodically tested
- Trained specialized crew
- Not permanently manned installations
- Safety zone marked
- Installations indicated on charts
- Qualifications required by the competent authority
