INTRODUCTION

The Sub-Regional Training Course on Marine Emergencies (hereinafter referred to as "the Course") was held at the Izola Marina Conference Room in Izola, Slovenia, between the 11 and 13 November 2008. The Course was organised by the Regional Marine Pollution Emergency Response Centre for the Mediterranean Sea (REMPEC) in co-operation with the Slovenian Maritime Administration and the Administration for Civil Protection and Disaster Relief of Slovenia. It formed part of REMPEC's programme of activities 2008/2009 approved by the 15th Ordinary Meeting of the Contracting Parties to the Barcelona Convention and it followed a specific proposal made by Slovenia during the last Meeting of REMPEC Focal Points held in Malta in May 2007.

ORGANIZATION OF THE COURSE

The organization, the preparation and the delivery of the Course was entirely the responsibility of REMPEC, supported by the Slovenian Maritime Administration and the Administration for Civil Protection and Disaster Relief of Slovenia. The latter provided all on site logistical support both prior and during the training course.

The role of REMPEC included:

- preparation of the programme of the training course;
- identification, selection and invitation of lecturers;
- course co-ordination;
- making necessary arrangements for the travel and accommodation of the foreign participants and lecturers;
- covering the costs of travel and daily subsistence allowance of the foreign participants and lecturers:
- covering the cost of fees for the lecturers, when applicable;
- covering the cost of the conference room facilities, coffee breaks and lunches of all participants and lecturers;
- providing participants with all Course material in both paper and electronic format; and
- preparing and disseminating the Course CD Rom containing all course related material including the present Report of the Course.

The role of the Slovenian Authorities included:

- identification of a hotel to accommodate the foreign participants, lecturers and Course Coordinator:
- identification of the venue of the training course including all audio visual equipment;
- local transport arrangements including airport/hotel/airport transfers for the Course Coordinator, lecturers and foreign participants; and
- organising and covering the costs of a dinner for all participants, lecturers and Course Coordinator.

Mr. Jonathan Pace, REMPEC's Senior Programme Officer, acted as the Course Co-ordinator and ensured the smooth running of the Course, which was conducted in the English language.

The Course commenced on Tuesday 11 November 2008 at 1000 hrs following the registration of the participants. Mr. Jonathan Pace, Senior Programme Officer at REMPEC and Course Co-ordinator welcomed the participants on behalf of the Director of REMPEC, whilst Mr. Bruno Potakar, Director of the Slovenian Maritime Administration, delivered the opening remarks. It was concluded on Thursday 13 November 2008 with a short closing session during which Mr. Pace thanked the lecturers for their presentations and input during the course, as well as the participants for their interest and active participation. He informed the participants that, in due course, REMPEC will be forwarding them a certificate of attendance (c.f. **Annex V**) as well as the Course CD Rom containing all course related material. The CD Rom will also be disseminated to the lecturers. Mr. Potakar expressed his appreciation to REMPEC for organising the Course and to the lecturers for their input.

COURSE OBJECTIVE, PROGRAMME AND PARTICIPATION

The objective of the Course was to focus on various aspects related to emergencies at sea (with particular reference to the ship casualty side) including *inter alia* the legal background, the public authorities involvement in marine emergencies (including decision making process and impediments), the ship's interests, and the handling of the media. The programme of the Course, which is given in **Annex I**, focused on the following four main elements:

- Background information on marine emergencies, maritime accidents and casualties;
- Legal background related to marine emergencies;
- Emergency response; and
- Emergency response and contingency planning.

The Course programme included two case study presentations on the shipping casualties involving the MSC Napoli and the MV Und Adriatic. At the end of the Course, participants also had the opportunity to take part in a table top exercise related to the topic of the training course entitled "Responding to a Marine Emergency".

The Course was aimed at Maritime Administration officials, harbour masters, and other persons involved in immediate intervention after a maritime casualty such as civil protection and coast guard officers. A total of thirty-one participants attended the Course including two participants from Bosnia Herzegovina, Greece, Italy, and Montenegro respectively, three participants from Croatia, and twenty participants/observers from Slovenia. A number of experienced professionals, including Sir Robin Middleton, the former UK Secretary of State Representative (SOSREP), lectured during the Course. The list of participants is given in **Annex II**.

EVALUATION OF THE COURSE

At the end of the Course, the participants were requested to complete an Evaluation Form prepared by REMPEC in order to have their feedback on and assessment of the Course, and also to enable them to make recommendations regarding future training activities of the Centre. The Evaluation Form, reproduced at **Annex III**, did not include the name of the participants in order to obtain an objective assessment. Unfortunately, only eleven participants returned duly completed evaluation forms. This notwithstanding, a summary of the results of the replies is given in **Annex IV**.

Participants were satisfied with the Course and indicated that it generally met their expectations. Likewise, a large number of participants judged the content and quality of the lectures/presentations as either "very good" or "good". All participants found the table top exercise useful. Finally, participants generally felt that the knowledge acquired during the training course will help them in their current work and indicated that they acquired new knowledge.

CONCLUSION

The participation and feedback of the participants and the lecturers indicated that the objective of the Course was achieved and that the Course was considered a success. This was also confirmed by the responses obtained from the Evaluation Form. It is to be noted that the majority of participants were of a very good level and that this was due to the fact that many of them were involved in work related to preparedness for and response to marine emergencies. Overall, participants obtained an in-depth knowledge on the various aspects related to marine emergencies and the Course no doubt helped to raise awareness amongst them of the specificities in this domain.
